Dr. Alfred,

Good afternoon, I am in receipt of your email. In my communication to faculty in Mid-July, I indicated that we were transitioning back to face-to-face instruction for the Fall 2021. Those courses that are not face to face will be because there is a facility infrastructure issue (e.g. no classroom to accommodate the capacity of the class, renovations in progress, etc.), or faculty have received an approved ADA reasonable accommodation through Human Resources.

I also indicated that faculty should check Bison Web for designated class instructional modality for their fall courses as the schedule is being regularly updated. The process is that faculty would communicate and discuss whether there were any approved accommodations and/or facility issues with their Chairs. The Chairs would then update (through submission to the Registrar's office) the teaching modality in Bisonweb. Bisonweb does not dictate the teaching modality, but should reflect what has been indicated by the faculty through the Chairs. Thank you.
